

CJC Singapore Seminar Series Update, Summer 2017

The CJC Singapore Seminar Series 2017 is proving to be a great success. There was a full house during the seminars concerned with pilotage and passing of risk in CIF and FOB contracts, presented by Master Mariner Paul Martin and Prof Filippo Lorenzon (pictured below), respectively.

The next seminars in the series are set out below:

- Thursday 27 July, 6pm registration for a 6:30pm start: *"2017 Maritime Case Law Update: Part One"*. Here we cherry pick the most important court decisions and maritime legal developments from the first half of 2017. The talk will summarise everything new that you need to know from this period. Presented by various members of the CJC Singapore team, you will have the opportunity to take part in the discussion as usual.
- Wednesday 13 September, 6pm registration for 6:30pm start: *"Cyber Crime in Shipping: A Case Study"*. Ian Short will explore how to respond to a cybercrime attack where hire payments are intercepted, increasing your chances of recovering the fraudulent proceeds and dealing with your contractual counterparties. The seminar will take the form of an interactive case study.
- Wednesday 25 October, 6pm registration for a 6:30pm start: *"Turning bill of lading claims on its head: Carrier suing Cargo"*. It is more common in our industry to see cargo interests pursuing carriers for cargo damage or shortage claims. In this interactive seminar, we look at the carriers' right to sue cargo interests, the types of claims that may succeed and how.
- December (TBC): *"2017 Maritime Case Law Update: Part Two"*.
